These are gifts of sheer grace, Granted solely by Christ's merit. Amen. 		The Heidelberg Catechism was written in 1563 and is a part of the constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA). It is composed of 129 personal questions, addressed to "you," with corresponding answers that draw upon biblical language. The Heidelberg Catechism was written to highlight the common ground between Lutheran and Reformed Christians, and it reminds us of the rich history of our faith.
