It is most often used with a text (The Summons) by John Bell, written to go with this tune after his acceptance into the Iona Community in 1980. The Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum in Glasgow houses one of Europe's great art collections. It is one of the top visitor attractions in Scotland. At 1:00 p.m. Monday-Saturday, a thirty-minute organ recital is presented on the Kelvingrove Organ, over 100 years old. Each of these recitals begins with a playing of the tune KELVINGROVE.
