

This morning we join congregations all over the country in our Opening Hymn. The Committee on Local Arrangements of PC(USA) General Assembly 223 commissioned Mary Louise Bringle to write a hymn text for the biennial meeting taking place this week. The new hymn incorporates the GA's theme "Renewing the Vision: Kindom **Building for the Twenty-first** Century" with biblical metaphors, social justice themes, and even a surprising nod to the GA's location in St. Louis. The hymn is set to the tune BEACH SPRING. We know Mel Bringle through her many hymns and her service as chair of the Presbyterian Committee on Congregational Song who created our hymnal, Glory to God.
