Recently I was talking with Mary Caroline Lindsay about stewardship. She told me that many years ago, it was the deacons (not the elders) who were responsible for



the church's finances. She told me her father often said, "God loves a cheerful giver and so do the deacons!"

Well, I'm happy to report that Central has many cheerful givers. Since the last pledging report compiled 10 days ago, the 2024 pledges total \$1,082,290.00. This is \$152,804.00 more than 2023's total pledges, a 16% increase so far. We have received 137 pledges and anticipate another 15 pledges before the end of December, hopefully 152 pledges. This would be 10 more than last year.

Sixty-six members and friends increased their pledge from last year and 19 are new pledges. The average amount per pledge is \$7,899.93, a remarkable amount.

All of these numbers demonstrate amazing generosity at Central, for which we praise God and rejoice. Our faithful giving will enable us to continue supporting Christ's work at our doorstep, throughout our community, and around the world.




