The Rev. Ruth Faith Santana-Grace, Co-Moderator of the 225th General Assembly to preach Sunday



The Rev. Ruth Faith Santana-Grace, Co-Moderator of the 225th General Assembly will preach Sunday at Central. The Rev. Ruth Faith Santana-Grace (she/her/hers) is Co-Moderator of the 25th General Assembly, the highest non-staff elected office in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), representing over 1 million members. Ruth serves together with the Rev. Shavon Starling-Louis under the theme "Unbounded We Thrive."

Ruth began serving as Executive Presbyter of the Presbytery of Philadelphia in February of 2014, making her the first woman and person

of color to be installed in their more-than-300-year history. She is also a lauded author, scholar and has served on boards at institutions including Princeton Theological Seminary and The Presbyterian Foundation. You can read her biography by clicking *here*.


Young Adults Gathering February 9

February 6 is PBG Training Day; Lobby Day takes place March 14

This year's Georgia General Assembly is a very important session because the state has the largest ever (\$16 Billion) surplus of state funds that should be used to expand access to healthcare, mental healthcare, affordable housing, and other critical programs to help vulnerable Georgians. Presbyterians for a Better Georgia (PBG) needs the voices of people of faith like you who:



- Oppose cuts to the state low-income housing tax credit that supports construction and preservation of affordable housing;
- Support passage of the Safe at Home Act (HB 404) that provides essential protections for renters facing sudden eviction; and
- Advocate for increased funding for housing and mental health supports for unsheltered Georgians.



The Issues in Theology class will resume its discussion of Tony Keddie's book, *Republican Jesus: How the Right Has Rewritten the Gospels*. Keddie, a professor of Christian

History at the University of British Columbia, wrote this book in response to what he feels is a political misuse of Biblical interpretation and history. The class will pick up with Chapter 4 and will continue through the remaining consecutive chapters until finishing on March 17. Note that while this is a provocative book to read, a summary of salient points from a subject chapter is provided each Sunday morning, so one does not have to read the chapter in order to participate in the class discussion.

Automated Giving through Realm

If you would like to make your pledge payments electronically, you can do so through your Realm account by visiting *cpcatlanta.org*, navigating to the giving page, and selecting 2024 Member Giving from the drop-down menu. To set up scheduled giving, you can choose "give multiple times" with a start date and ending date and gifts will process automatically on the schedule you choose (monthly, weekly, bi-monthly, etc.).

Realm does not update your scheduled gifts automatically with your new pledge

Should you already have an automatic gift set up, you may need to adjust the gift to match your new pledge or set up a new 2024 gift while canceling the 2023 gift if it does not have an end date. If your 2023 automated giving had an end date of December 2023, you will need to set up a new scheduled giving for 2024. This is done by logging into your Realm account, going to your giving tab, and clicking on the schedule button. You can use the three dots on the right to edit, hold, or cancel your giving.
