Rae Baker is a seasoned cellist with over a decade of musical mastery. Hailing from a family where music is not just a tradition but a way of life, Rae's journey has been an exploration of diverse genres, seamlessly blending classical elegance with the soulful rhythms of gospel, neo-soul, R&B, jazz, and the spiritual landscapes of contemporary Christian music.

As a soloist, she paints evocative melodies that captivate audiences, combining technical precision with an emotional resonance that leaves an indelible mark. She has graced the stages around the globe including iconic Carnegie Hall, Atlanta Symphony Hall, Spivey Hall, and Rivercenter Legacy Hall

Under the guidance of Professor Wendy Warner, her mentor and muse, Rae's journey unfolded into a symphony of technical prowess and emotive depth. She has also performed in masterclasses and/or studied with Daniel Laufer, Astrid Schween, Charae Kruger, and Alexandria Rice. She holds a bachelor's degree in music.
