

Rev. Nibs Stroupe set to participate at Central October 20, 27

On two Sundays at the end of October, Rev. Nibs Stroupe will join Central to teach and preach. On October 20, he will teach a combined adult class based on his most-recent book, "She Made a Way: Mother and Me in a Deep South World." Described as "a memoir of survival and growth under the twin threats of white supremacy and male dominance. It is an intimate story of perseverance and coming of age: how a single, white working mother and her only son made their way in the patriarchal and racist world of postwar Helena, Arkansas, a Mississippi river town." Central member John Blake wrote the forward to the book. This special class will take place in the Parlor off of Tull Hall.

The next Sunday, October 27, Rev. Stroupe will be our guest preacher.
