BOOK TOUR: YOU ONLY GET WHAT YOU'RE ORGANIZED TO TAKE. On Saturday, May 24th at 6:00 pm Central will be hosting Rev. Dr. Liz Theoharis and Noam Sandweiss-Back, co-authors of the book, *You Only Get What You're Organized to Take: Lessons from the Movement to End Poverty*. Liz is the Director of the Kairos Center for Religions, Rights, and Social Justice at Union Theological Seminary and Co-Chair of the Poor People’s Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival. She is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and teaches at Union Theological Seminary in New York City. **She will also preach here at Central on Sunday, May 25th.** Noam is an organizer with longstanding experience supporting movements for social and economic justice having served as Director of Partnerships for the Poor People’s Campaign and currently working with the Kairos Center on a special project to counter the power of Christian nationalism.


